

Academic Assistance

- Tutoring
 - > Some teachers offer before/after school
 - Peer tutoring: list available in Student Services after the 2nd week of school
 - \geq Private tutoring: list available in Student Services after the 2^{nd} week of school(\$\$\$)
- Guided Practice Skills (GPS), 7th pd: class for students to work on assignments and to receive help from teachers when needed

Academic Assistance

- Weekly assignments can be seen on the teacher's Edmodo page (format varies from teacher to teacher)
- If your child is absent, please have them check their Edmodo for missing assignments before they return to school
- If it is a planned absence, the student should coordinate with their teacher about their assignments ahead of time

Information Now (INOW) Parent Portal

- > Free Service that can be accessed on the internet and smartphones
- It allows you to view:
 - Attendance by period and all check-ins and outs
 - Progress reports, report card grades, class averages, individual activities and unofficial transcripts
 - > Student schedule by term
 - > School calendar and announcements
- Available after the 2nd or 3rd week of school

Progress Reports and Report Cards

- Progress reports are sent home with the student every 4 weeks; given out during 4th period.

High School Transcript

- A credit is a point assigned to a class.
- In high school, credits are issued after each semester.
- Each 1/2 year (semester) class counts as 1/2 credit.
- Each full year class counts as I credit.
- Needs grade of 60 or higher at the end of each semester in each class in order to earn a credit.

How does your student get promoted?

- He/she must earn credits.
- Can earn up to 7 credits per year because we have 7 classes each day (GPS study hall is a non-credit class).
- > At end of year, promotion is determined by credits:
 - Freshman (9th grader) 0-5 credits
 - Sophomore (10th grader) 6-11 credits 12-17 credits
 - Junior (IIth grader) Senior (12th grader)
- 18+ credits
- To Graduate
- 24 credits

Credit Requirements

Alabama Diploma

- 4 English 4 History
- 4 Math
- 4 Science
- I Physical Education 1/2 Health
- I Career Preparedness (Computer)
- 3 CTA Electives (Career Technology, Fine Arts, or Foreign Language)
- 2 1/2 Additional Credits
- = 24 credits

ACT Aspire (10th)/ACT (11th)/ACT WorkKeys (12th): Required for everyone.

PSAT is an optional test & it is recommended that students taking Honors courses in the 10th & 11th grades sign up

for it.

AP World History

- AP Exams will be held May 2nd-12th. AP World History is 12th.
- > Any student taking an AP class must take the AP exam.
- > AP class fees and AP exam fees need to be paid to the student's AP teacher by the end of October. The exam fee is **\$91** and there is a separate teacher supply cost of **\$16-\$25**.

College and Career Center

- Most programs are designed as two-year programs.
- Students will attend the CCC for 2 hours a day with the potential to earn 2 credits per year. They will take their 4 academic classes at their high school.
- Students should have the required core credits AND elective credits needed for graduation (PE Life-I year/Band-2 years, Career Preparedness, & Health) to attend CCC.

Extracurricular activities
